Introductory Remarks: The meeting was called to order at 1:34 pm by Grant Giventer.

- The meeting started with a welcome to the meeting.
- HOSAC voting members were identified by name and accounted for.
- All voting members were present.

II. Quorum present?

Yes, six out of eight voting members or proxies are present.

III. First Order of Business: Review Agenda

- Grant Giventer facilitated the first order of business.
- The group reviewed the meeting agenda together. Grant confirmed the members had thoroughly reviewed the agenda before moving to approve the agenda.
- Grant moved to approve the meeting agenda, and Miki Kiyokawa verbally motioned to pass the meeting agenda.
- All voting members unanimously approved the agenda.

IV. Second Order of Business: Summarize July HOSAC Meeting

- All members reviewed the Meeting Minutes from the 7/14/25 HOSAC meeting.
- Julyn "Ike" Mahoe-Garcia verbally motioned to approve the minutes.
- Voting members unanimously voted to approve the 7/14/25 meeting minutes.

V. Third Order of Business: Opioid Settlement Trust Fiscal Updates

- The current balance in the trust is \$39,407,397.03 as of 08/01/2025.
- Trust funds currently receiving interest beginning in October 2024 Total received \$290,411.26

- October \$45,877.99
- o November \$34,942.38
- o February \$45,275.37
- o May \$164,351.52
- o Interest rate for fiscal year 2022 was 1.15%, 2023 was 2.8%, 2024 was 4%
- Deposited payments August 2025:
 - o Teva \$973,067.00
 - o Allergan \$989,275.95
 - o CVS \$1,767,412.32
 - o Distributor Payment 5 \$3,564,029.25
 - o Total: \$7,293,784.52
 - o Funds will be sent to counties with next check sent out
- ADAD has purchased 12,512 kits Narcan kits for \$418,594.94 and 11,690 Padagis kits for \$314,190.45 through SOR funds (as of August 2025 for current calendar year)
 - Will continue to use SOR funds to purchase naloxone until the ending of federal fiscal year (September 30). If SOR 4 year 2 funds come in, we will continue to use SOR funds in the next fiscal year.
- ADAD has purchased 25,000 fentanyl test strips for \$15,000.00 through SOR funds (as of August 2025 for current calendar year)

VI. Fourth Order of Business: DOH Updates

- ADAD efforts to increase OSP staffing
- County share updates
 - Oahu MOA is finalized, awaiting execution by court, council, mayor, and DOH director.
 Check is ready once MOA is complete.
 - o Hawaii received and submitted invoice for \$250,000; estimated 4 weeks for check
 - Maui Awaiting Maui to approve MOA
 - Kauai invoice received, need to finalize MOA
- Treatment goals and efforts:
 - Clean and Sober Homes RFP is in progress
 - o JABSOM Programs contract under development
 - Perinatal efforts ongoing
- Harm reduction efforts
 - Naloxone distribution boxes
 - 30 naloxone boxes delivered to DOH office in Honolulu and 25 delivered to DOH Kapolei office
 - Boxes landing in Kona 8/12/2025; Grant will be assisting with delivery
 - MOAs are still in progress. Plan is to send to the counties for input and discuss which locations the counties would like them placed
 - DOH locations being identified with CAMHD, AMHD, and District Health Offices
 - Installation supplies being tested and purchased
 - OSP will facilitate inquiry with all UH campuses, Judiciary, local hospitals and clinics, all 4 counties, and other entities.
 - Naloxone readiness in schools

- ADAD currently providing to HAIS schools statewide
 - Offered to all HAIS schools; 50 schools requested naloxone so far
- DOE schools
 - All secondary schools provided naloxone per DOE
 - Will request update on DOE elementary schools
- Prevention Strategies
 - HIDTA Fentanyl Summit
 - Currently reviewing the project; set to meet on 8/13/25
 - o Olelo
 - The Planned Spending Report was sent out last week for review
 - Olelo YXC website information displayed
 - Upcoming year's contest is under discussion with Olelo to purchase categories
 - Plan is to utilize settlement funds for high school students to create their own
 PSAs with the guidance of a consultant from Coalition for a Drug Free Hawaii
 - High school students contest videos from 2024-2025 Olelo YXC shown
