Introductory Remarks: The meeting was called to order at 1:30 pm by Grant Giventer.

- The meeting started with a welcome to the meeting.
- HOSAC voting members were identified by name and accounted for.
- 6 of 7 voting members were present.
- Welcomed new DAG, Alana Bryant

II. Quorum present?

Yes, seven out of eight voting members or proxies are present.

III. First Order of Business: Review Agenda

- Grant Giventer facilitated the first order of business.
- The group reviewed the meeting agenda together. Grant confirmed the members had thoroughly reviewed the agenda before moving to approve the agenda.
- Grant moved to approve the meeting agenda, and Jill Rohan verbally motioned to pass the meeting agenda.
- All voting members unanimously approved the agenda.

IV. Second Order of Business: Summarize March HOSAC Meeting minutes

- All members reviewed the Meeting Minutes from the 03/09/26 HOSAC meeting.
- Voting members unanimously voted to approve of the 03/09/26 meeting minutes.

V. Third Order of Business: Opioid Settlement Trust Fiscal Updates

- Trust funds currently receiving interest beginning in October 2024 – Total received to date **\$600,206.22**
 - October 2024 - \$45,877.99
 - November 2024 - \$34,942.38
 - February 2025 - \$45,275.37
 - May 2025 - \$164,351.52
 - July 2025 - \$138,285.50
 - August 2025 - \$85,925.54
 - September 2025 - \$83,547.92
 - Interest rate for fiscal year 2022 was 1.15%, 2023 was 2.8%, 2024 was 4%
- The current balance in the trust is **\$33,316,707.62** as of 04/09/2026.
 - Endo funds not included until the MOA with the city and county is amended
- **OSP Expenditures and Balance**
 - Total current expenditures as of the period ended 12/31/25 is **\$6,497,220.51**.
 - TRB branch total expenditures: **\$3,423,864.00**
 - Prevention branch total expenditures: **\$421,379.46**
- ADAD discontinued Narcan purchases
- ADAD has purchased 25,000 fentanyl test strips for \$15,000.00 through SOR funds (as of February 2026 for current calendar year)
- County share updates
 - Oahu – County reps scheduled to pick up check this week
 - Hawaii – Received their county share check
 - Maui – County’s check ready to mail out
 - Kauai – Received county share check

VI. Fourth Order of Business: ADAD Updates

- Treatment goals and efforts:
 - JABSOM Programs
 - Ho’ola UTelehealth and Second Responder
 - i. Launched February 18, 2026 on Maui
 - ii. Provide prompt access to free addiction medicine care after overdose stabilization by Maui emergency services
 - iii. Expand warmline access to all Maui County residents by June 1, 2026, and Hawaii County expected to begin by mid-summer 2026, then Kauai and finally Oahu
 - iv. Visited Molokai Gen. and met with Molokai EMS. Both tentatively agreed to work with HUT over ODs, though not many opioid/fentanyl cases.
 - v. Intention is program will expand from OUDs to SUDs and other addiction cases

- SOR Updates
 - No updates currently
- Harm reduction efforts
 - Naloxone Distribution Boxes (NDBs)
 - OSP traveled to Molokai March 27, 2026
 - Lanai DOH locations deployment in coming weeks
 - MOAs with all four counties pending review and approval
 - First deployment at courthouses (Hilo) April 1m 2026
 - Traveling to Kona 04/15/26 to place more NDBs including Kona courthouse, and district courthouses (pending execution of agreement).
 - OSP coordinating placement agreements with Judiciary, UH campuses, DHS, local hospitals and clinics, and other entities.

Continuing effort to distribute large quantities of naloxone across the state.

 - HIFTF 5th annual Fentanyl Summit April 29
- **Maui County**
 - Partners in healing initiative doing really well. The group covers cell block program and Lt. Bishal Wario would be a great voice for us within MPD
 - Reorganizing prosecutor's office , including personnel recruitment. Adding a new executive assistant position to report directly to prosecutor. It will be very competitive and specifically tasked with managing initiatives including the overdose initiative
